The AMI-SEC meeting was hosted by EnerNex Corporation in Knoxville, TN. The team discussed OpenSG organization; received updates on AMI Enterprise, AMI-SEC and the newly formed AMI Network; and lessons learned presented by Doug Housman.

Technical Discussion

OpenSG/UtilityAMI

The Chair presented the UCAlug organizational structure, its coordination with external smart grid groups, the Board of Directors organization and role (including the current board members) and the OpenSG subcommittee organization. Membership to OpenSG was also discussed. The Chair continued with UtilityAMI's definition, mission, goal and current tasks.

Discussion continued with the HAN Systems Requirement Specification (SRS) that ratified through utility member's votes. Other utilities are now adding their name of endorsement.

Zigbee HomePlug

Ivan O'Neill presented the purpose and goals of the Zigbee HomePlug Alliance Marketing Working Group (MWG). Wayne Longcore discussed his role as the liaison to this group and is currently seeking a member to fill this role.

AMI Enterprise

Greg Robinson (AMI Enterprise Chair) presented an update of AMI Enterprise. Team leads have been selected for the SRS Team, Service Definitions Team and the Use Case Team. Deliverables have been identified and discussed. Artifacts produced will be made available under creative commons license on the SmartGridipedia website.

AMI-Sec

Darren Highfill (AMI-Sec Chair) presented an update of AMI-SEC. ASAP is currently handling two key deliverables: Architectural Description and System Security Requirements document that are being proposed for vote soon. The AMI-SEC Roadmap is currently in the final stages of editing. The AMI-SEC Charter and Scope have also been revised for updating.

AMI Network

Matt Gilmore (AMI Network Chair) gave an overview of AMI Network. The working group will be working to establish functional requirements for network interoperability.

UtilitySG Interest Group

The Chair proposed a UtilitySG Interest Group to serve as a collaboration forum on smart grid development to minimize duplication of effort and manage expenses associated with industry participation. Benefits for forming this group under the UCAlug were discussed and included operating under a well established non profit (UCAlug), by-laws, charter and operating rules already established, mitigation of anti-trust concerns, established information sharing portals, and access to other UCAlug resources.

AMI Lessons Learned

Doug Houseman delivered a presentation of <u>AMI Lessons Learned</u>. Topics covered were PLC vs. radio performance, call center impacts of AMR, meter data value, Enel vs. WPS and a survey collected by utilities that have implemented an AMI program entitled, "What would I change..." (Reference AMI Lesson Learned slides)
